



Voters and opinions on hunting
June 2017

Introduction

- ORB asked 2038 people to identify three issues that would affect their vote at the general election (unprompted). Only 8 (0.39%) mentioned hunting.
- When asked to compare the impact of hunting on their vote with other issues people ranked hunting below wind farms, green belt development, mobile phone connectivity, animal welfare and HS2. Only badger culling had marginally less impact on peoples' votes.
- When given a list of policy areas to choose from, 28 of 2038 people ranked hunting above all other issues. Only one of these 28 voted for a Conservative candidate at the last election.
- This research is consistent with research carried out before the 2010 and 2015 elections by ORB, which also found less than 0.5% of people identifying hunting as an issue that would affect their vote.
- The online poll also explored the relationship between voting behaviour and use of the campaigns website 38 degrees. 80% of regular 38 degrees users said they will never, or are unlikely to, vote for a Conservative candidate



What are the main issues that will influence who you vote for at the next election?






Of those who mention fox hunting unprompted, only one said they would consider voting for a Conservative candidate in future


Comparative voting priorities (prompted)
