



ATTITUDES TOWARDS PRESIDENT TRUMP'S DECISION ON JERUSALEM

BLUF



- There is global disapproval of President Trump's decision to recognise Jerusalem as the capital of Israel. More than two in three (71%) disagree with the proposal (59% strongly). In the Arab world alone disagreement stands at 94%.
- Traditional allies in Jordan (97%), South Korea (46%) and the UK (45%) all disagree with the proposal.
- But worryingly a majority (52%) say that it gives the Palestinians more justification to use violence to achieve their own state. In an already volatile Arab world this figure increases to 77%.
- As a result, more than two in three (70%) of those polled around the world think the decision will result in an increase in terrorism in the Islamic World. The number increases significantly in Yemen (87%), Syria (82%) and Iraq (76%) – the same countries currently fighting violent extremist organisations at home.
- The appetite for peace, and belief that it is achievable, between Palestinians and Israelis has always been brittle at best. However, the poll suggests Trump's decision has made it a lot harder to achieve now.





EXPECTED INCREASE IN TERRORISM



