#### **METHODOLOGY**

Each week ORB International polls a **nationally representative** sample of n=2,000 adults aged 18+ throughout England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. The core tracking questions are :-

Q. When thinking about the Coronavirus here in the UK which of the following do you think is most likely to happen over the next month?

- 1 The worse is yet to come
- 2 The situation will remain largely the same as it is now
- We are over the worst of it things will begin to improve

How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statements?

- 1 I think the UK Government is handling the Coronavirus crisis well
- 2 I believe the threat from the Coronavirus is exaggerated

Topical questions each week are inserted and not necessarily tracked week on week.





The statistical margin of error at the 95% confidence level is ±2.2%




### CORONAVIRUS: HOW THE PUBLIC SEE THE NEXT MONTH









#### CORONAVIRUS: RETURNING TO WORK






 A majority of people (53%) wouldn't feel safe returning to work, just 28% have said that they would feel safe to do so.





#### CORONAVIRUS: PUBLIC TRANSPORT






 If public transport was the sole option to travel next week, two thirds (63%) would still be unwilling to use it. Under a third (30%) would use public transport.






### CORONAVIRUS: UNDER CONTROL?





# CORONAVIRUS: LIFTING OF RESTRICTIONS






 There is little appetite to lift restrictions on restaurants, bars and cinemas, just 15% believe the government should do so. Just over three quarters (76%) believe they should be maintained.





#### CORONAVIRUS: SOCIALISING FRIENDS/FAMILY






 Vast majority believe socialising is a risk to their health (78%), while few (14%) believe it doesn't pose a risk.





#### CORONAVIRUS: MEASURES





 Support for the lockdown measures is high. Just under one in ten (9%) believe they have gone too far while an overwhelming majority (86%) see them as necessary.
