METHODOLOGY

Each week ORB International polls a **nationally representative** sample of n=2,000 adults aged 18+ throughout England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. The core tracking questions are :-

How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statements?

- 1 I think the UK Government is handling the Coronavirus crisis well
- 2 I think that the spread of the virus is now under control
- 3 I think the Prime Minister is showing leadership during this crisis

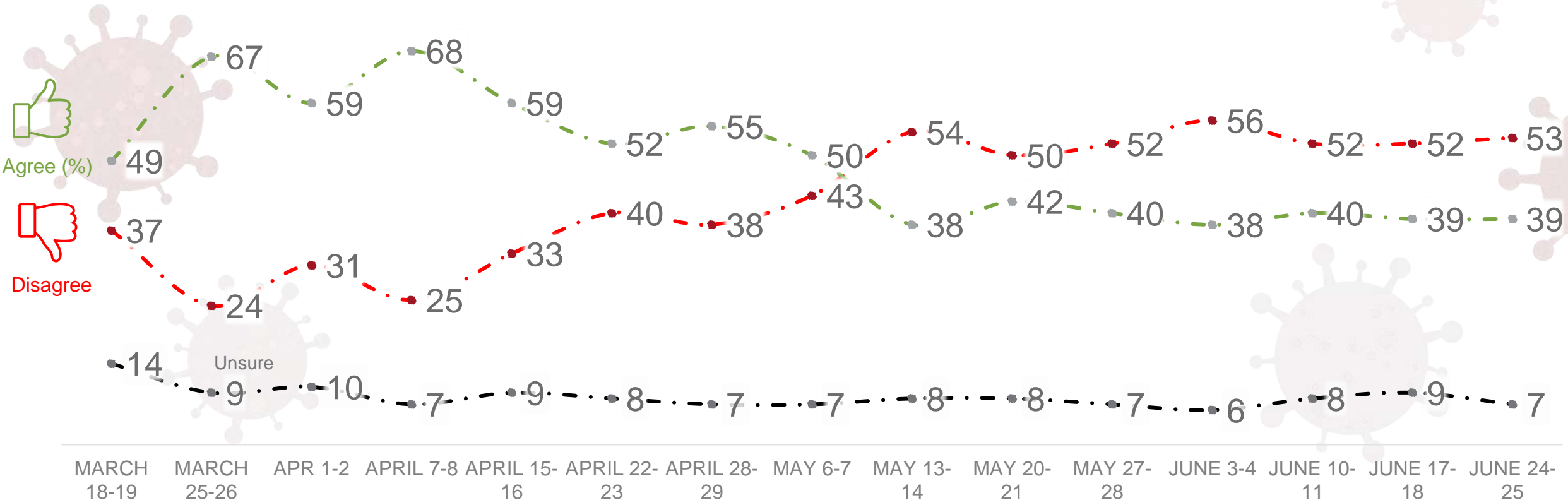
Topical questions each week are inserted and not necessarily tracked week on week.

- **Sample Sizes :**

- The statistical margin of error at the 95% confidence level is $\pm 2.2\%$

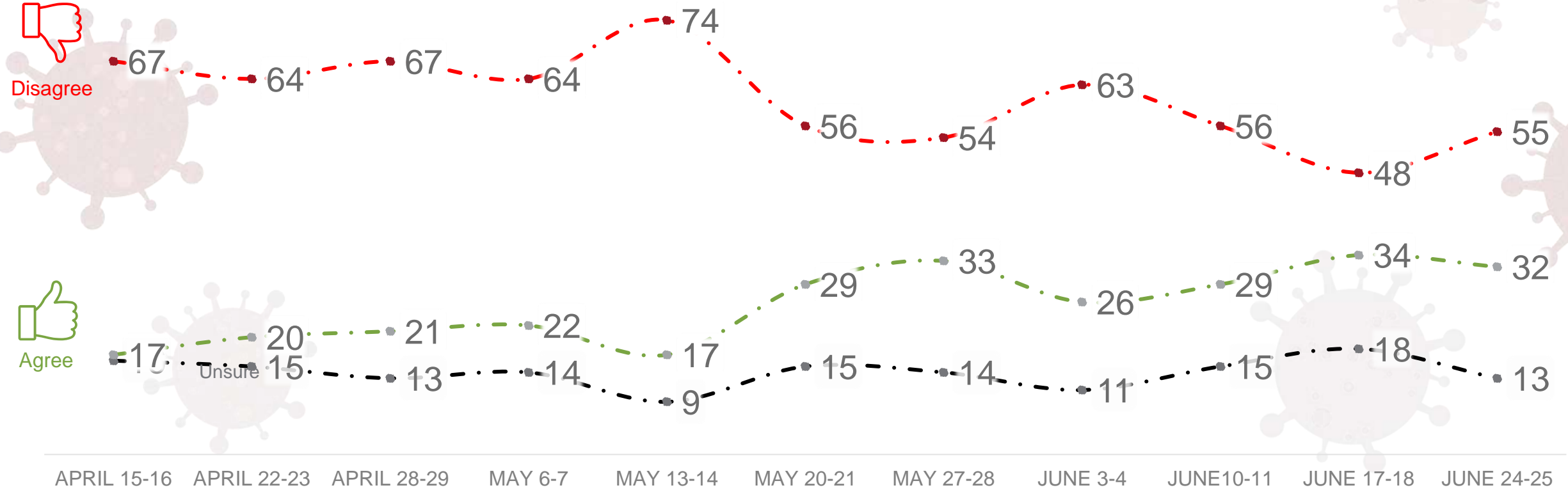


CORONAVIRUS : IS THE GOVERNMENT HANDLING IT WELL?

CORONAVIRUS : UNDER CONTROL?

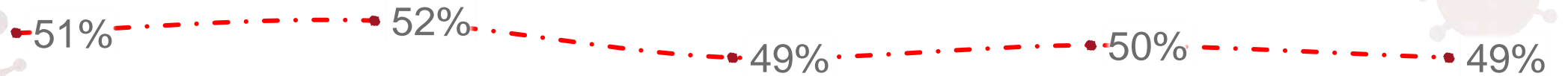


Q How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement? I think the spread of the virus in the UK is under control

CORONAVIRUS : PM'S LEADERSHIP



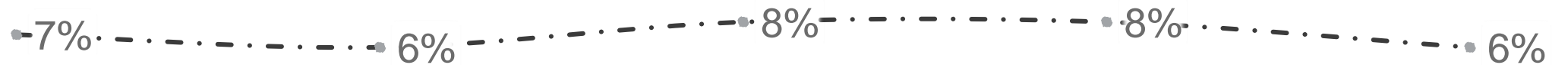

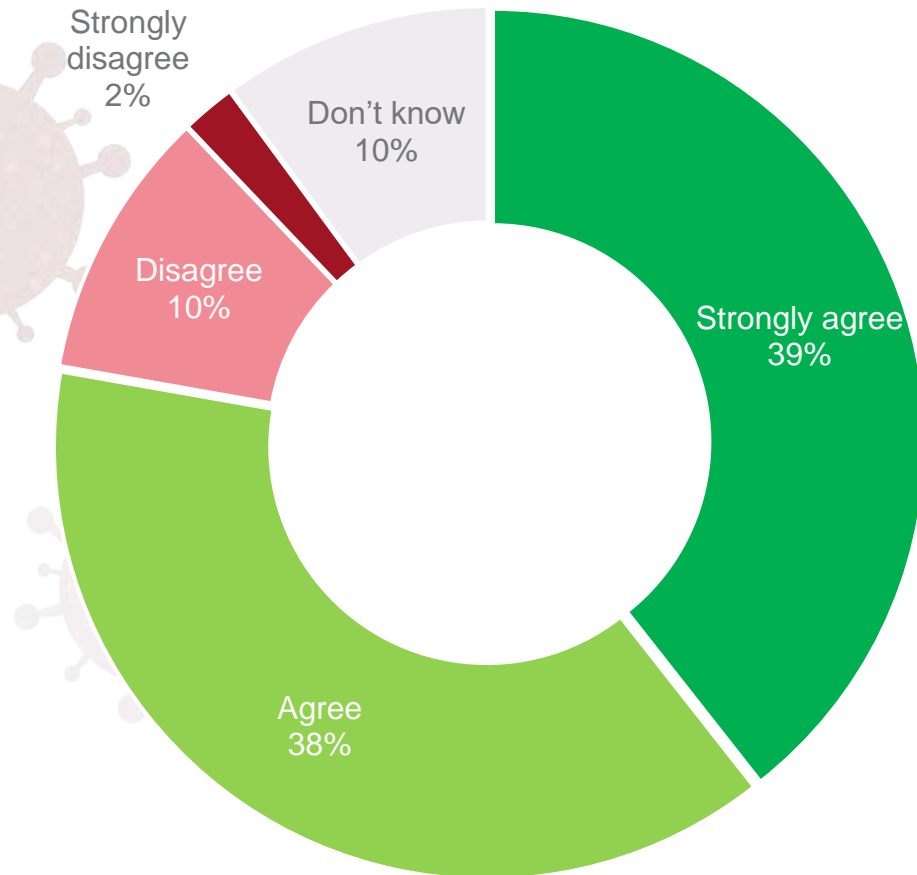

CORONAVIRUS : TRAVEL BAN FOR WORSE HIT COUNTRIES

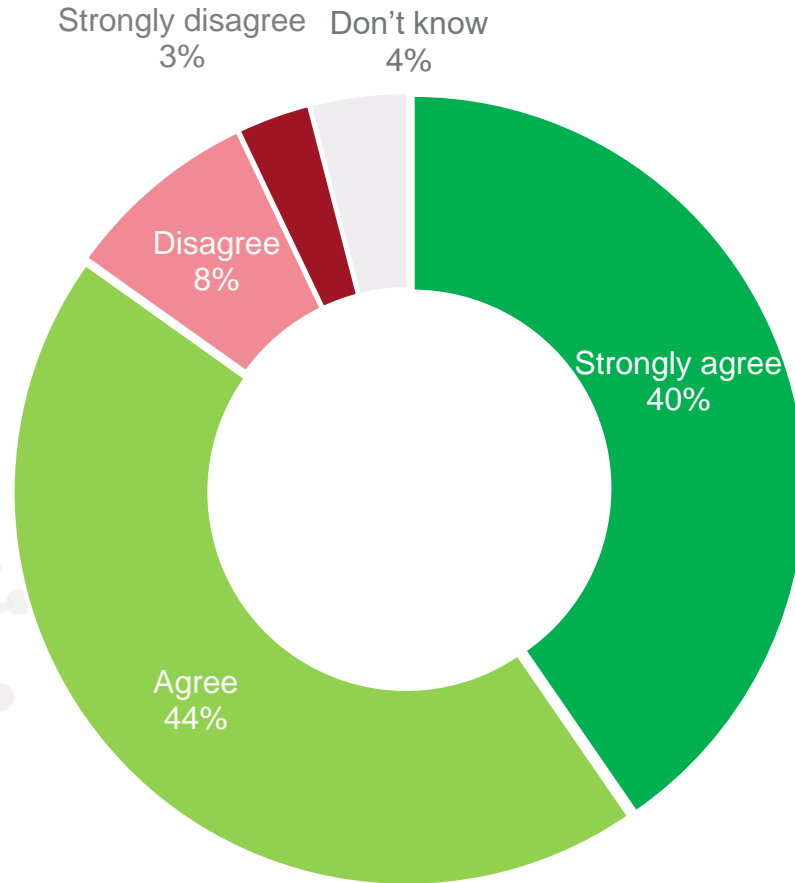


The introduction of a travel ban to/from countries with a higher infection rate than the UK would be overwhelmingly supported. Over three quarters (77%) think flights should be grounded.

Q How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement? I think flights to countries with higher infection rates (such as Brazil, India, the US) should be grounded indefinitely

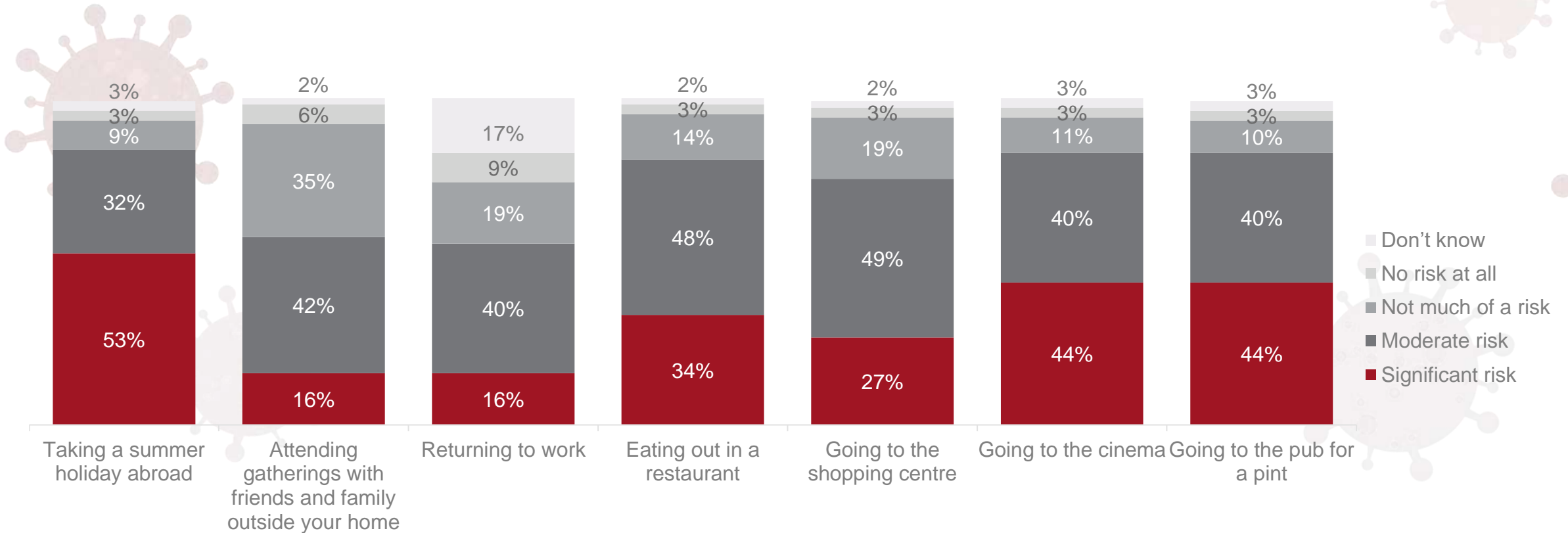
CORONAVIRUS : FEAR OF SECOND WAVE



Only a small minority (11%) are unconcerned about the effect of a second wave – the vast majority (85%) fear it could be damaging.

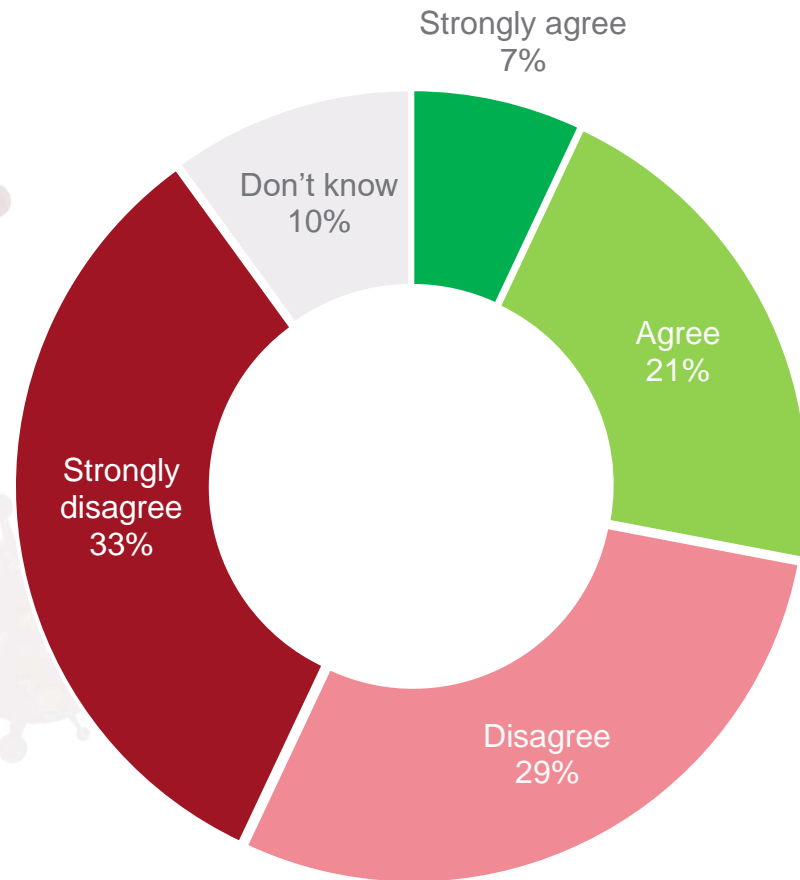
Q How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement? I am worried about a second wave of the Coronavirus hitting the UK hard

CORONAVIRUS : INTENTION TO EAT/DRINK OUT



Concerningly for the hospitality industry, only around a quarter (28%) say they intend to go out for food and drinks when they are open again.

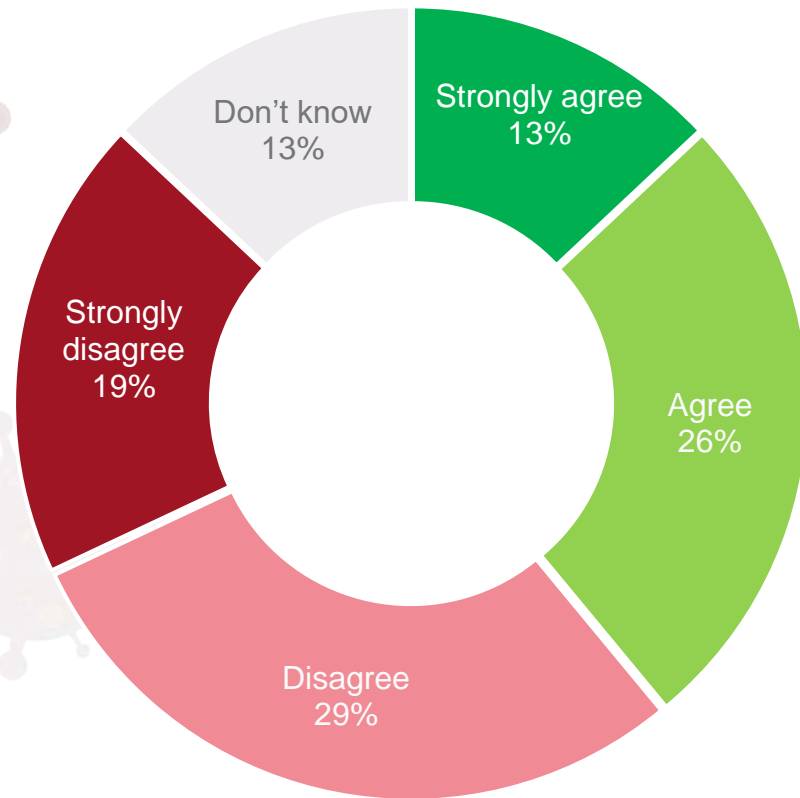
Unsurprisingly, those in the younger age groups are far more likely to be heading out than older age groups: 47% of 18-24 year olds compared to 18% of 55-64 year olds.



Q How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement? I intend to go out for something to eat/drink at a COVID-19 secure restaurant/pub as soon as they are open again

CORONAVIRUS : MAJOR EVENT POSTPONEMENT



Marginally more have opted **not** to postpone major events in their lives than those that have (48% vs 39%).

Q How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement? I have decided to postpone some major events (for example, events such as moving house/ having a baby/getting married etc.) because of the COVID-19 restrictions in place
